As you’ll see, a few simple organizational tools can make a big difference. For example:

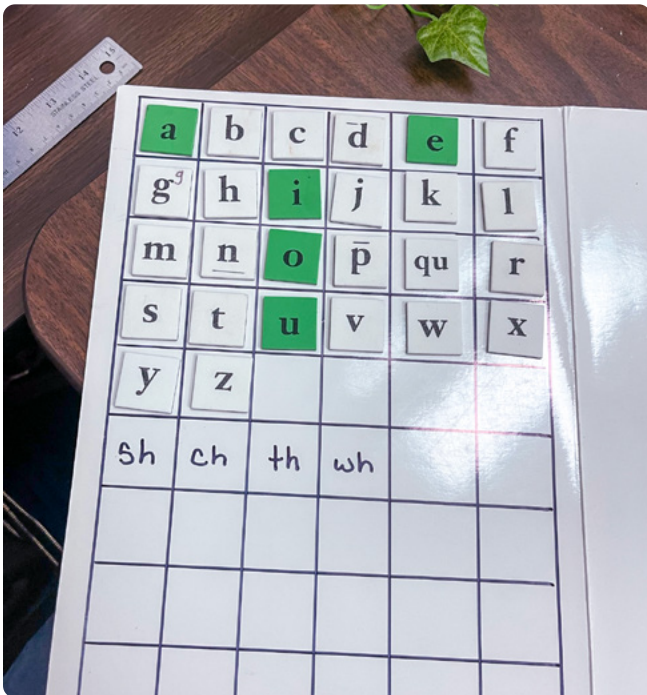
- ✓ Tackle boxes

- ✓ Binders and/or three-prong folders



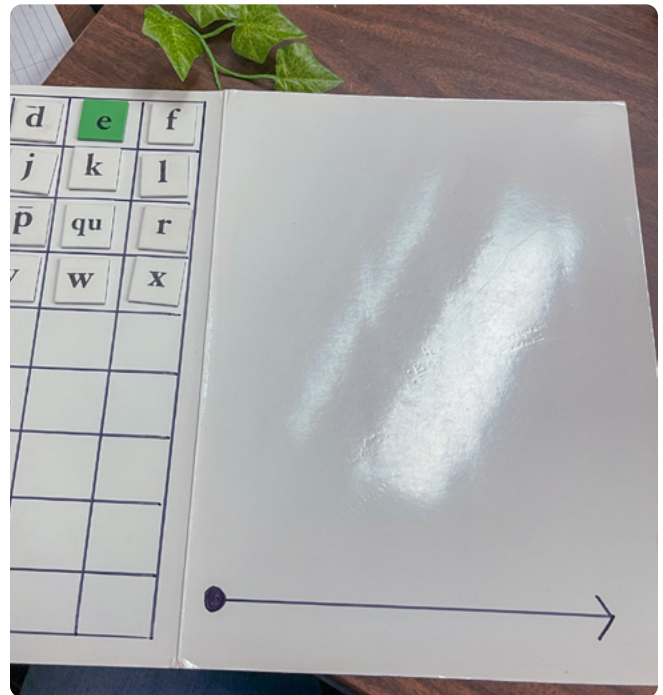
Bulletin Board Idea

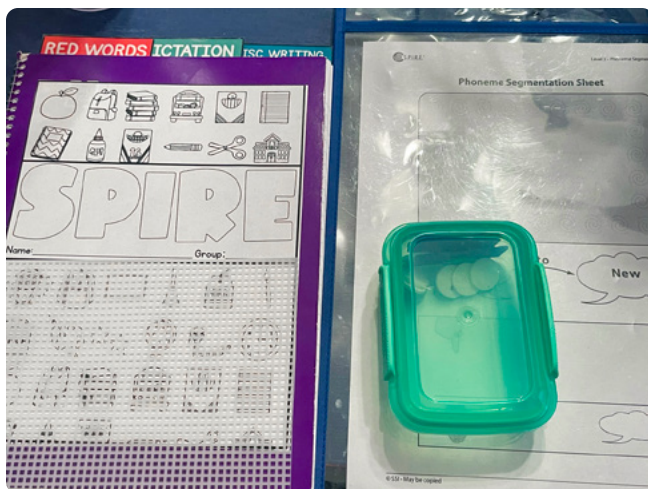


Extra Tile Storage



Magnetic Board Layout

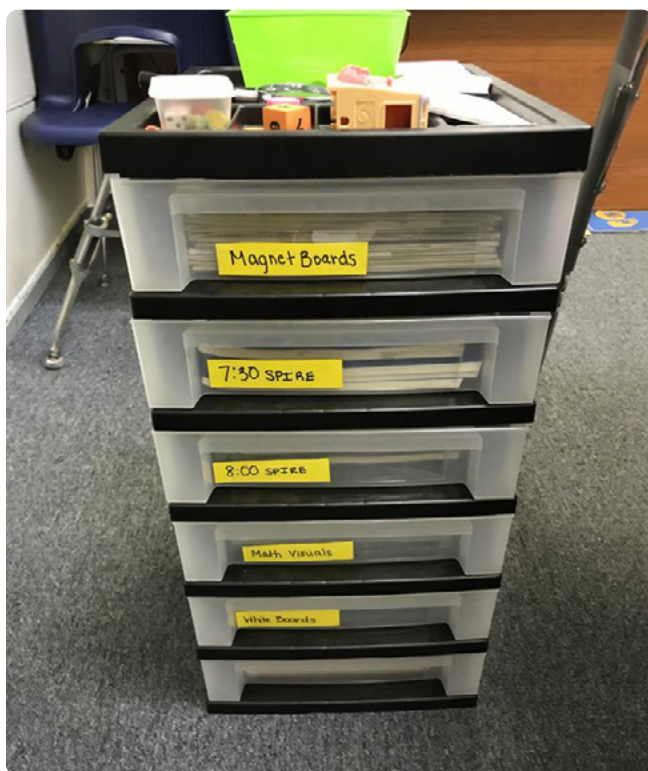




Student Material Organization (Dictation Paper & Phoneme Segmentation)
